

Toxic chemicals from mobile washing and detailing can cause runoff that pollutes our roadways and storm drains, which lead to the Mojave River Watershed.

Follow these stormwater-savvy steps to keep our local waterways pollution-free:

- Clear the area of debris, then throw it away in a trash can
- Guard nearby storm drains with sandbags or coverings
- Use biodegradable products
- Use a water shutoff nozzle on the hose to prevent excess runoff
- Wash and detail vehicles on a lawn instead of a driveway to reduce runoff
- Invest in a portable vacuum recovery system to safely contain and dispose of water runoff
- Avoid washing the undercarriage to prevent oil, metal and antifreeze from entering runoff

Dispose of all toxic materials at a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center.
